Biographical Note by The HistoryMakers®

Henry Presswood was born on October 7, 1921, in Electric Mills, Mississippi. From 1948-52 Presswood played shortstop and third baseman in the Negro Leagues. During his time in the Leagues, Presswood starred for both the Cleveland Buckeyes and the Kansas City Monarchs.

After leaving professional baseball, Presswood went to work at Inland Steel, where he played fast-pitch softball. He won several trophies and also a good sportsmanship award. Presswood retired from Inland Steel after more than thirty years of employment.

Presswood passed away on December 27, 2014 at the age of 93.

Detailed Description of the Collection

Series I: Original Interview Footage

Video Oral History Interview with Henry Presswood, Section A2001_059_001_001, TRT: 0:28:05

Henry Presswood reflects on his family background, childhood, and introduction to baseball. Presswood, born on October 7, 1921, was the last of four children born to Josephine (Matthews) and Dee Presswood in Electric Mills, Mississippi. Presswood recalls spending time in the Provident Baptist Church, where his father was a deacon. Hendon's father also worked at the saw mill in town; his mother cooked for several boarders. One of the boarders, Jimmy Faison played for the local baseball team, the Mills City Jitterbugs and taught Presswood how to catch a baseball. Also talks about schooling experiences; he was good student who loved to learn. After Presswood completed 10th grade, he left school to work in the saw mill. Presswood later moved to Birmingham, Alabama after he was discharged from the army, where he played baseball in the city league

Henry Presswood reminisces about his childhood community in Electric Mills, Mississippi, service in the United States Army and early baseball career. Presswood enlisted in the Army in 1945. During wartime, Presswood, like some other athletes were exempted from fighting overseas. After playing baseball in the Army, Presswood moved back to Mississippi where he began to work in the saw mill in Canton, Mississippi. While he was in Canton, Willie Gray, a player with the Negro Baseball League team, the Cleveland Monarchs recruited him to the team. Presswood shares stories about playing with other Negro League players such as Satchel Paige, Willie Mays, and Othello Renfro.

Henry Presswood reflects on his career in the Negro Baseball League and life after he retired from the game. In 1948, Presswood approached the manager of the Kansas City Monarchs, John Buck O'Neil to ask for an opportunity to play alongside one of his idols, Satchel Paige. O'Neil welcomed Presswood to Kansas City, Missouri and began to mentor him and teach him important fundamentals of the game. After Jackie Robinson broke the colorlines in the Major Baseball League, the Negro League began to slowly phase out. Presswood sensed his age was beginning to slow him down, so he rejected offers to play baseball in Mexico and decided to return to the saw mill to earn a living to support his family. Presswood also reflects on his legacy and shares his hopes and concerns for the African American community.
